As we celebrate 60 years of Dallas College, I want to thank each of you for the legacy you helped build. Your contributions laid the foundation for the bold steps we're taking today—and tomorrow.



Recently, I had the distinct honor of representing Dallas College at the New York Stock Exchange, where I participated in ringing the Closing Bell. It was a powerful moment that symbolized the national recognition of our mission and the momentum we're building together. Standing on that platform reminded me of the scale of our impact and how far we've come thanks to the strong groundwork you helped lay.

With the fall semester now underway, we welcomed students back to campus through our Smart Start program—a dynamic kickoff filled with pep rallies, workshops, and essential wraparound services. From guided success planning to mental health counseling and transit passes, Smart Start ensures every student begins their journey with the support they need to thrive.

This fall also marks the official launch of our Bachelor of Applied Technology in Software Development, a program designed to meet the growing demand for tech professionals in our region. But we're always looking ahead. That's why we're preparing to launch our fourth bachelor's degree—the Bachelor of Applied Science in Management—next year. This program is uniquely designed for working professionals, integrating real-world management practice through cooperative education and flexible pathways that bridge theory with on-the-job application.

We've also introduced the PATH Project, a \$5.7 million federally funded initiative to expand healthcare workforce training across North Texas. In partnership with regional colleges and the Dallas-Fort Worth Hospital Council, this four-year grant will provide targeted training and over \$1.3 million in tuition assistance to thousands of students—especially those from underserved communities. It's a bold step toward equity and access in healthcare education.

And through our Dallas College Foundation, we've launched Dallas College Enterprise Ventures, a new initiative to incubate mission-aligned businesses that fuel student success and regional impact. From coworking spaces and podcast studios to business advising and startup boot camps, this effort empowers entrepreneurs and community members to thrive within our ecosystem.

There is so much energy and innovation driving Dallas College forward, and it all builds on the remarkable legacy you helped shape. Thank you for being part of our story.

I want to suggest that we plan to visit the Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza this fall. I understand that the museum has undergone renovations recently, in addition to which there is a special exhibition now called "Colorful Memories: November 22 Through a Child's Eyes." The museum calls this "a rare look at history through the lens of childhood," and it includes "original crayon drawings created by a first-grade class two weeks after the assassination." These are presented together with a short film by Richard Snodgrass which discusses the children's perceptions of the death of President Kennedy. I suggest we meet there on Friday, November 7 at 11:00 a.m.

The museum is at 411 Elm St. We can buy our tickets online, or, I am told, we can just get them at the door: \$20 for seniors. There is some parking at the museum, and there are several other parking lots nearby. It is also possible to ride DART to the West End Station, which is about three blocks from the museum. We could eat afterwards at the Y O Steakhouse, also about three blocks away, if that's agreeable to everybody. Don Baynham has scheduled tour of the Hatco factory in Garland October 10; a copy of information is on each table; please sign if interested in attending and leave form on table.

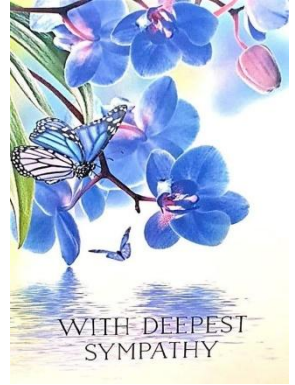
Bob Chambers has scheduled a docent-led tour at the SMU Meadows Museum on June 7 at 11 a.m. The current exhibit ends in mid-June.
