The *Aerospace sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing complete aircraft, missiles, space vehicles, aerospace engines, propulsion units, and related parts and auxiliary equipment. The industry also includes aircraft conversion, prototype development, and the overhaul and rebuilding of aircraft and propulsion systems to original design specifications.

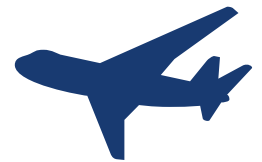

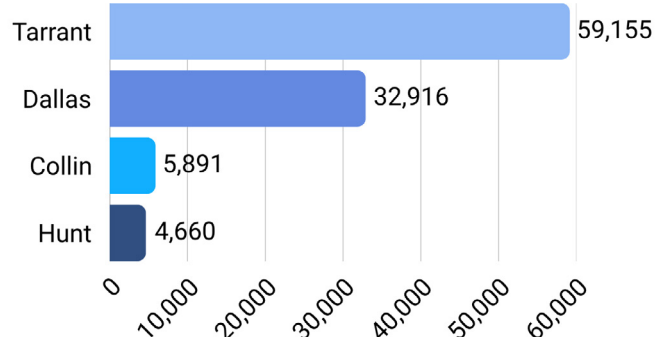
