History of ECHS

- Work began in late 2004 with exploring concept.
- Funding began with Bill & Melinda Gates
 Foundation Communities Foundation of Texas
 University of North Texas Carrollton-Farmers
 Branch ISD in conjunction with BHC.
- Initial ECHS implemented at BHC in Fall 2006
- Students recruited from all C-FB ISD Middle Schools.

ECHS Program Criteria



Early College High School at Brookhaven College

The ECHS Selection Committee uses the criteria below in selecting students for the program.

- First generation in the family to complete a 2-year Associate's Degree or a 4-year Bachelor's Degree
- Low socioeconomic background
- Academic performance, such as grades and test scores
- Recommendations from the staff of the middle school
- Personal characteristics such as maturity, persistence, and teamwork

Involvement of BHC Faculty

- Concerns of Faculty
- Formed ECHS transition team in Fall 2007
- During 2007-2008, involved BHC faculty in discussions with C-FB ISD curriculum coordinators and established discussion opportunities between BHC and ECHS faculty
- During summer 2008, began to integrate ECHS students into college classes. While concerns expressed initially by some BHC faculty, many became "converts".
- During 2008-2009, encouraged BHC faculty with ECHS students in classes to maintain contact with ECHS principal and counselor.

Facilities Challenges/Plan

- 2006 charter 9th grade class on BHC campus in temporary buildings
- 2007 9th and 10th grade classes on BHC campus
- 2008 11th grade class at BHC 10th grade class shifted to Ranchview High School 9th grade class started at Ranchview High School
 - Brought about by both CFBISD budgetary issues involving utilization of personnel and space issues at BHC

Facilities Challenges/Plan continued...

- 2009 11th and 12th grade classes at BHC 9th and 10th grade classes at Ranchview High School with 3 BHC classes offered at Ranchview HS: PE, Health, Art Appreciation
- 2010 Goal is to bring <u>all</u> ECHS students back to BHC in slightly remodeled self-contained P Building.
 - New facilities and remodels of vacated spaces will be complete and CFBISD/BHC commitment to continuance is reaffirmed

Strengths of ECHS Initiative

- <u>True</u> partnership with Carrollton-Farmers Branch ISD built on past relationships with BHC
- Solid working relationship among ECHS principal, BHC liaison, and ISD and college administration with support from University of North Texas (intermediary) and Texas High School Project (Communities Foundation of Texas) staff
- ECHS at BHC Transition Team
 - Co-chaired by BHC faculty member and interim VPI
 - Membership consisting of BHC and ECHS faculty members, ECHS counselor, BHC advisor, ECHS principal & ECHS liaison

Future of ECHS

- By Fall 2010, the "P" Building may be used completely by ECHS.
- We would prefer to have 9th-10th Grades located on BHC campus; however, C-FB may not have finances to add additional space they require.
- If 9th- 10th Grades remain at Ranchview, however, BHC can certainly make such a model work.
