

Actions Taken:

2011-12 Planning



- Reviewed data at colleges in DCCCD
- Surveyed students, faculty & staff
- Focused on assessment and data collection
- Examined data and best practices with leaders from various colleges
- Identified key District policies and procedures to promote student success
- Worked to reallocate existing resources
- Developed a comprehensive action plan

Connection: College Readiness (K – 12)	Placement Test Preparation, Program of Study, Guidance, Dual Credit
Entry: First Time in College	Advising for Career Pathways and Redesign of Core Course
Progress: Student who completes 30+ hours	Redesign Developmental Education and Core Curriculum to Reduce Time (send 30+ credit hours communication)
Completion: Certificate & Degree	Automatic graduation & reverse transfer



Legislation to Support
